SANTOS TDU: RETURN TO ADELAIDE BY BIKE



There are many routes by bike back to Adelaide, fast, via some of our famous wineries, by train, via the Adelaide Hills... Enjoy the trip home and we look forward to seeing you in the Barossa again soon!

The Quickest Route- Ride to Gawler and Train to Adelaide

The safest and quickest way back the City centre from the Barossa is to ride to Gawler via the Barossa Valley Way from Tanunda to Lyndoch and Gawler and take a right hand turn at the lights when you hit the Murray Street in Gawler (at the bottom of the hill). Heading north for approximately 200m you will see the Gawler Central Railway Station next to Coles Supermarket on the left hand Side. The train will take you to the Adelaide Central Station. See below for ticket information

Avoid the traffic -Visit some Wineries along the Jack Bobridge track between Tanunda and Lyndoch

Grab yourself a map of the Jack Bobridge Track at the Barossa Visitor Centre in Tanunda and follow the route to Gawler. The route takes you past a number of wineries including St Hallet Wines, Jacobs Creek, Jenke Vineyards, Lou Miranda Estate, Kellermeister Wines, Hemera Estate, Schild Estate and Kies Estate and Burge Family Winemakers. Lyndoch Green is the ideal place to park to access this track as a park and ride point for this purpose.

Take the scenic route-Ride back to Adelaide via Lyndoch and Williamstown

The best route option is to follow the Barossa Valley Way to Lyndoch and turn left to ride to Williamstown. From the Williamstown Bakery corner, go right to Kersbrook. At Kersbrook go straight ahead until to you get to the crest of a hill with a T junction and turn right onto the Chain of Ponds Road and then the first left towards Gorge Road via Tippett Road. Turn right on Gorge Road and head west following the Torrens River. Once you leave Torrens Gorge (entering Athelstone), look for the Torrens River Linear Path for a scenic and relaxed ride to the City. A quicker option is to follow Gorge Road and turn left onto Lower North East Road which will take you to the City and Eastern Suburbs.

Ride to the Adelaide Hills - Via Angaston, Eden Valley and Mt Pleasant and Torrens Scenic Route

If you are riding to places such as Hahndorf, Lobethal, Birdwood or Gumeracha, the best route from the Northern end of the Barossa is via Angaston to Eden Valley and Mt Pleasant which connects the Torrens Valley Scenic Route linking the major towns in the Adelaide Hills. Riding from the Southern end of the Barossa follow the Barossa Valley Way to Lyndoch, turn left as you enter the town and head to Williamstown. At Williamstown there are two options, take a left turn to ride to Birdwood to pick up the Torrens Valley Scenic Route or right to Kersbrook, Cudlee Creek and Lobethal.

Catch the Train from Gawler

Bikes are not allowed on buses or trams, however, they can be carried for free on trains during the following times:

- Monday to Friday 9.01am 3pm and 6pm to last service when space is available.
- Saturday, Sunday & public holidays all day when space is available.

At all other times a concession fare must be purchased for your bike. Please see the reverse side for ticket types and prices.
