<b>A&amp;H Doddridge Blacksmith Shop &amp; Angaston Museum</b> 19 Murray Street, Angaston	Established in 1873, the A&H Doddridge forge is now a working museum, thanks to dedicated volunteers. <b>Anlaby</b> 829 Anlaby Rd, Hamilton	Established in 1839, Anlaby is proud to be South Australia's oldest merino stud and one of its most important heritage properties. With heritage-listed gardens, historical architecture and sweeping rural vistas, visitors are welcome to enjoy guided tours of the Anlaby gardens and the homestead. <b>Angaston Heritage Trail</b>	Enjoy a 3km walk along the streets of Angaston while soaking in the local history	<a href="#">Map here</a> or ask at the Visitor Information centre
<b>Barossa Chateau Art &amp; Antiques</b> 1 Hermann Thumm Dr, Lyndoch	One of the largest private collections of porcelain in Australia including pieces from the great porcelain houses of Meissen, Sevres, Worcester, Chelsea & Stint. <b>Barossa Goldfields</b> Bowden Cottage, Para Wirra Rd	Discover the gold mining history of the Barossa area on one of the three loop trails. 'Victoria Hill circuit' is the shortest loop, just 1.4kms long and takes about one hour to complete. The 'Phoenix circuit' is 4.8kms long, takes two hours and includes part of the Victoria Hill circuit. The 'Lady Pearce circuit' is 5.8kms which takes approximately 3 hours and includes parts of the other two circuits.	Open 7 days (closed on fire danger days)

<b>Chateau Tanunda</b> 9 Basedow Road, Tanunda	<b>Private Chateau Tour and Tasting</b> - Explore the birthplace of the Barossa with a privately hosted tour to discover 130 years of winemaking at Chateau Tanunda. <p><b>Herbig Family Tree</b> Angaston Road, Springton</p>	<p>The Herbig Family Tree is a large, hollow red gum tree estimated to be up to 500 years old, with a diameter of seven metres at its base and a height of 24 metres.  The tree was the first Australian home of 27 year old Friedrich Herbig who arrived in South Australia in 1855. In 1858 he married 18-year-old Caroline Rattey and took her to live in the tree home. The first two of their 16 children were born there.</p>	
<p><b>Heritage Trails App</b></p>	<p>The Barossa Heritage Trails app can be downloaded for free from the App Store or Play Store. The app features self guided tours of the townships of Angaston, Light Pass, Mount Pleasant, Nuriootpa and Bethany. As well as The Tanunda Museum, Barossa Driving Tour and Barossa Vintage Festival.</p>	
<p><b>Luhrs Cottage Museum</b> Light Pass Road, Light Pass</p>	<p>Take a step back in time and visit Luhrs Cottage Museum, situated in the small village of Light Pass. Featuring a display of early settlers heirlooms, a schoolroom, cellar, 'longdrop toilet and an agricultural shed with a display of farming implements. <p><b>Seppeltsfield Winery</b> Seppeltsfield Road, Seppeltsfield</p>	<p><b>Centenary Tour</b> - The ultimate historical tour of Seppeltsfield, the Centenary Tour is a once in a lifetime wine experience. <p><b>Seppeltsfield Palm Tree Drive</b> Seppeltsfield Road, Seppeltsfield</p>	<p>A five-kilometre trail of Canary Island Date Palms, planted by Seppeltsfield workers during the Great Depression. Over 2000 palms now line the sides of Seppeltsfield Road, providing one of Australia's most visually spectacular driving avenues.</p>	
<p><b>Seppelt's Family Mausoleum</b> Seppeltsfield Road, Seppeltsfield</p>	<p>The striking structure that is the Seppelt's family mausoleum was built in 1927. It stands tall as an inspiring and touching tribute to the family who established one of Australia's oldest wine estates and played such a pivotal part in this region's history. Perched atop a quartzite ridge, use your vantage point to survey sweeping vineyards as well as the grand buildings of Seppeltsfield and reflect on what was created by generations of ambitious and energetic Barossa pioneers.</p>

<p><b>The Carl Lindner Collection of Classic Jaguars</b> 55 Basedow Rd, Tanunda</p>	<p>Located just minutes from the main street of Tanunda on Basedow Road, the collection is sure to delight car enthusiasts, history buffs or in fact anyone who appreciates the sleek design of a classic E-Type. Proving that there is more to the Barossa than just Wine! The outstanding private collection represents a near 40-year passion for the famous marque with a stunning array of both original and immaculately restored motor vehicles.
