A&H Doddridge Blacksmith & Angaston Museum 19 Murray St, Angaston	This heritage listed Blacksmith Shop was the industrial heart of the village, a place of ideas and work. \$5 admission fee with children under 15 free.	Saturdays, Sundays & Public Holidays 1pm to 4pm (08) 8564 3222
Barossa Chateau Art & Antiques 1 Hermann Thumm Dr, Lyndoch	One of the largest private collections of porcelain in Australia including pieces from the great porcelain houses of Meissen, Sevres, Worcester, Chelsea & Stinton	Daily tour at 11am—\$10 per person (Bookings essential) (08) 8524 4920
Barossa Goldfields Bowden Cottage, Para Wirra Rd	Enjoy the Barossa Goldfields historical walks where gold was found in 1868. Walks range from 45 minutes to 3 hours. Group tours can be arranged	Open 7 days (closed on fire danger days) For group tours call 0407 712 621
Barossa Museum 47 Murray St, Tanunda	Situated in the former Post & Telegraph office in Tanunda since 1970. It houses an extensive collection of artefacts from the Barossa region with focus on the settlement of the area.	Open Friday to Tuesday: 10am to 4pm (08) 8563 0600
Chateau Tanunda 9 Basedow Rd, Tanunda	Historic estate tour of the Chateau & grounds. Includes a glass of sparkling wine.	Daily tour at 11:00am—\$19 per person (08) 8563 3888
Collingrove Homestead 450 Eden Valley Rd, Angaston	A National Trust property built in 1856 by the original colonialist in the area, George Fife Angas. Now converted into a beautiful bed & breakfast.	Guided group tours by appointment only (08) 8564 2061
Friedensberg Historic German School Museum & Cemetery Cnr Lablack & West Dewells Rd, Springton	Located close to the Helbig Tree, is the museum and state heritage listed cemetery. Entry is free to the cemetery, museum is open by appointment.	Guided tours by appointment only (school groups welcome) — \$5 per person (08) 8568 2287
Grand Organ Experience at Barossa Regional Gallery 3 Basedow Rd, Tanunda	The home of the historical Hill & Son Grand Organ (1875) which has been lovingly restored by the Organ Historical Trust.	Organ is played every Wednesday at 11:30am—\$5 admission fee (08) 8563 0849
Greenock Aviation Museum Kapunda Rd, Greenock	Located approx. 3kms from Greenock on the Kapunda Rd you will discover this private collection of preserved aircrafts.	Open Wednesday to Sunday 10am to 4pm Adults: \$5 & Children \$2 (08) 8562 8226
Herbig Family Tree Angaston Rd, Springton	This tree has a fascinating history, the Herbig family took up residence in the root of this huge tree upon their arrival to the area	Open everyday—free entry

Luhr's Cottage Light Pass Rd, Light Pass	Take an authentic look at life & education in the early Barossa days with a self-guided tour. Built in 1846, there is a settler house, classroom & large collection of original farm implements. Seppeltsfield Winery Daily Heritage Tour Seppeltsfield Rd, Seppeltsfield	One of the original wineries built in the Barossa in 1851, it is situated in the beautiful Seppeltsfield area. Seppeltsfield Palm Tree Drive Seppeltsfield Rd, Seppeltsfield	The Seppelts family are remembered for the palm trees for which the area is renowned. The palm tree drive was planted throughout the depression to keep workers in employment	
Seppelts Family Museum Seppeltsfield Rd, Seppeltsfield	The Seppelts family also built the Mausoleum on the highest point in the area. Built in 1927 for the family members and descendants.	
Tanunda Heritage Trail	Follow the markers along the 2.5km walk through the 'old town' of Tanunda	Free—see Visitor Centre staff for a map
Tanunda Kegel Club Tanunda Recreation Park, Bilyara Rd, Tanunda	The only remaining Kegel Club in the Southern Hemisphere. Available for group hire & visitors are welcome on club nights.
