Barossa Goldfields Bowden Cottage, Para Wirra Rd	Discover the gold mining history of the Barossa area on one of the three loop trails. 'Victoria Hill circuit' is the shortest loop, just 1.4kms long and takes about one hour to complete. The 'Phoenix circuit' is 4.8kms long, takes two hours and includes part of the Victoria Hill circuit. Herbig Family Tree

Angaston Road, Springton

The Herbig Family Tree is a large, hollow red gum tree estimated to be up to 500 years old, with a diameter of seven metres at its base and a height of 24 metres.

The tree was the first Australian home of 27 year old Friedrich Herbig who arrived in South Australia in 1855. In 1858 he married 18-year-old Caroline Rattey and took her to live in the tree home. The first two of their 16 children were born there.
